Yes, we will need for a harm analysis to be conducted on the requested documents. I have provided guidance below for the unclassified documents.

For the classified documents, we will need a classification review along with a Memo on the recommendations and justification. I have included a sample Memo to assist you.

Since there are two separate requests, please identify which documents are responsive to which FOIA request.

DON-NAVY-2020-006828 – All communications, e-mails, letters, memos, internal communications, notes etc. regarding AFOSI investigation case #3290517356125. Although this is an AFOSI investigation, in it, it states that the Division Head, Naval Air Warfare Center - Aircraft Division, Naval Air Station Patuxent River, MD was contacted. There was analysis on three videos which they determined there was "no sensitive symbology or other items of concern."

DON-NAVY-2020-007330 - All information and records including (but not limited to) reports, correspondence, queries, documents, letters, messages regarding the history and custody of the videos described as video of two F-18 Hornets tracking an unidentified Flying Object (UFO) » in the AFOSI File number 3290517356125 (see attached file for reference). The release of this video was investigated by the AFOSI in 2018 and the report mentions the Naval Air Warfare Center Aircraft Division as being in possession of those videos.

A harm analysis is a review of the documents (line by line) to determine if there is any information contained within that could potentially cause harm to the government if publicly released. We will need a Subject Matter Expert (SME) to review and address each item that they believe should be withheld, specifically explaining why this information could cause harm to the government if publicly released. We will need the responsive documents returned to us, highlighting (not "blacking out" or obscuring), any information that should be withheld. For each highlighted recommendation of withholding, please provide justification for our analysis, as well as, support for appeals and litigation.

When you are examining documents, think about what information you believe should be withheld from the general public. You are essentially using your subject matter expertise to help us at the FOIA office determine whether any of the exemptions apply. As you can see, the exemptions are relatively few and they are often narrowly applied. For us to withhold, we have to be able to articulate the potential harm if the exempt information were to be released to the public.

The most common FOIA Exemptions are (b)(3), (b)(4), (b)(5), and (b)(6). If no exemption applies, we must release. Even if an exemption does apply, we have to determine whether we can redact just the portion(s) of the document that is exempt and release the remainder.

EXEMPTION 1 - Records currently and properly classified in the interest of national security; ("SECRET", "CONFIDENTIAL", "TOP SECRET"). Documents must be properly and appropriately marked. Documents will need to undergo a classification review to ensure material is required to be protected and maintained as classified. Agency has duty to segregate and release nonexempt information, unless the segregated information would have no meaning;

EXEMPTION 2 - Records related solely to the internal personnel rules and practices of the DoD or any of the DoD Components. (This refers to conditions of employment in federal agencies, such matters as hiring and firing, work rules and discipline, compensation and benefits.);

EXEMPTION 3 - This exemption requires protection of information that is covered by another STATUTE that specifically exempts the information and permits no discretion on the issue. Records protected by another law that specifically exempts the information from public release (list here: <https://www.justice.gov/oip/blog/foia-post-2009-statutes-found-qualify-under-exemption-3-foia>); We most commonly used statutes are:

- **STATUTE 10 USC 130** – Unclassified technical data with military or space application. The term “technical data with military or space application” means any blueprints, drawings, plans, instructions, computer software and documentation, or other technical information that can be used, or be adapted for use, to design, engineer, produce, manufacture, operate, repair, overhaul, or reproduce any military or space equipment or technology concerning such equipment;
- **STATUTE 41 U.S.C. § 2102(a)(1)** – Contract Source Selection Information. **Prior** to contract award, certain procurement related proprietary and source selection information;
- **STATUTE 10 U.S.C. § 2305(g)** - DoD Contractor Proposals. Technical, management, or cost proposals submitted by a contractor in response to the requirement of a Department of Defense solicitation for a competitive proposal are covered under this statute except for any portions that were set forth or incorporated by reference into a contract;

EXEMPTION 4 - The new (b)(4) standard is that the information is exempt if 1) it is commercial or financial information, 2) that was provided to the government under an assurance of privacy, and 3) it is both customarily and actually treated as private by its owner. (Exemption 4 is what the contractor is looking for when they do their harm analysis. This allows us to withhold the contractor's proprietary information if they can reasonably show it would cause them competitive harm if released. Contractors are given the opportunity to conduct their own review to look for this information.);

EXEMPTION 5 - This exemption authorizes protection of internal records that are deliberative in nature and are part of the decision making process that contain opinions and recommendations. In practice, only three privileges are used with any regularity:

- Attorney work product
- Attorney-client communications
- Deliberative process
 - The record in question must be predecisional; and
 - It must make recommendations or express opinions on legal or policy matters.
 - Agency must be able to show that exposure of the deliberative process would result in harm.

EXEMPTION 6 – This exemption protects personally identifying information. We use this to redact employee names, phone numbers, e-mail addresses, etc.;

EXEMPTION 7 - Investigatory records or information compiled for law enforcement purposes;

EXEMPTION 8 - Records for the use of any agency responsible for the regulation or supervision of financial institutions;

EXEMPTION 9 - Records containing geological and geophysical information (including maps) concerning wells.
